Biographies

Lauren Shannon Jones is a writer and theatre-maker. She works with technological conceits to deepen audience immersion and interrogate the meaning of the performing body onstage. *Viva Voce* (Dublin Fringe 2018, nominated for a Fishamble New Writing award) cast an animated light sculpture as the second performer in a solo show. *Fetch* (Dublin Fringe 2019) used binaural technology as a transporting device to tell a story about travel in the anthropocene.

Eoghan Carrick is a theatre and opera director based in Dublin, Ireland. He works on new and established texts with a focus on innovative interpretations and interdisciplinary collaboration. He is an associate artist with Once Off Productions. Recent directing credits: 14 Voices from the Bloody Field and Theatre for One [and a little one] (Abbey Theatre, 2020), Bodies of Water (Dublin Fringe Festival, 2019; DFF Best Design Nomination), Midsummer (Project Arts Centre, 2019), Theatre For One (Cork Midsummer Festival, 2019; Irish Times Theatre Award Best Ensemble Nomination), INFINITY (Dublin Fringe Festival, 2018; DFF First Fortnight Award, DFF Best Design Award). He is an Adjunct Teaching Fellow in Trinity College Dublin and The Lir Academy. Since 2018, he has been associate director for Enda Walsh on productions with Landmark and Irish National Opera and with Tom Creed on multiple operas since 2015. He was the associate director with Corn Exchange Theatre Company from 2015 to 2020. Currently, Eoghan is creating a new audio-visual work called about: blank for Dublin Theatre Festival, 2021. Pauric Freeman is a freelance creative developer, artist and educator working with interactive technologies. His focus is on designing interactive experiences for clients and studios, developing mobile applications, websites, and interactive installations. Recent awards include the Arts Council's Next Generation Award 2021, Brightening Air 2021, the Film Bursary and Project Award for 2020, Science Gallery Rapid Residency and a nomination for Best Sound Design at the Irish Theatre Awards.
